FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order/Roll Call

Ms. Suit called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. Supervisors Lefere, Aponte and Walters were present. Supervisors Law and Gallagher were not present.

Ms. Willson asked Mr. Schrader to briefly review the Engineer's Report for the record.

Mr. Schrader stated the Master Engineer's Report contemplates total capital improvement plan (CIP) buildout. The CIP includes the two major access points from Watergrass Parkway and Wells Road, which are to be owned and maintained by Pasco County. The District will enter into a license maintenance agreement for the landscape enhancements and other assets within the neighborhood. The total CIP amount is \$59,103,000.00.

Mr. Schrader confirmed that he received the email with Bond Counsel's comments; the Master Engineer's Report will be adjusted and forwarded to District Management, with no changes to the Estimated Project Costs outlined in Exhibit C or descriptions in the CIP.

Ms. Willson posed the following questions:

Ms. Willson: Jordan, based on your experience, are the cost estimates in your Engineer's Report, as supplemented, reasonable and proper?

Mr. Schrader: Yes, they are.

Ms. Willson: Perfect. And do you have any reason to believe the project cannot be carried out by the District?

Mr. Schrader: No, I do not.

Ms. Willson: Perfect. Thank you.

Discussion ensued regarding the ownership of Watergrass and Wells roads,

reimbursable expenses from Pasco County, what assets can be financed, the first bond issuance

and the Board being mindful not to double-dip and get reimbursed by both the CDD and Pasco

County.

D. Master Special Assessment Methodology Report (for informational purposes)

Ms. Suit reviewed the Appendix Tables in the back of the Methodology Report.

Ms. Willson posed the following questions:

Ms. Willson: In your professional opinion, do the lands subject to the assessments

receive special benefits from the District's Capital Improvement Plan?

Ms. Suit: Yes.

Ms. Willson: In your professional opinion, are the special assessments reasonably

apportioned among the lands subject to the special assessments?

Ms. Suit: Yes.

Ms. Willson: In your professional opinion, is it reasonable, proper and just to assess the

costs of the project against the lands in the District in accordance with your Methodology,

which will result in the special assessments as set forth in the final assessment roll?

Ms. Suit: Yes.

Ms. Willson: Is it your opinion that the special benefits the lands will receive, as set forth

in the final assessment roll, will be equal to or in excess of the special assessments thereon

when allocated as set forth in the Methodology; do the special benefits exceed the special

assessments?

Ms. Suit: Yes.

Ms. Willson: And is it your opinion that it is in the best interest of the District that the

special assessments be paid and collected in accordance with the Methodology and the

District's assessment resolution.

Ms. Suit: Yes.

Ms. Willson: Thank you, Kristen.

Ms. Suit stated that this item contemplates a 24-month interest period.
